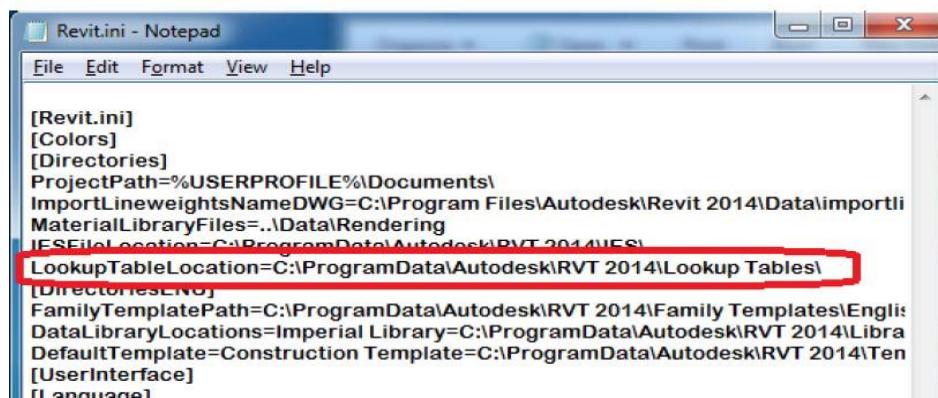
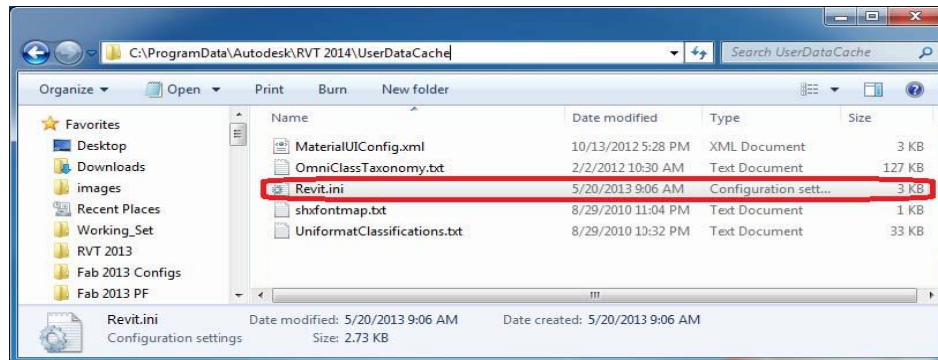


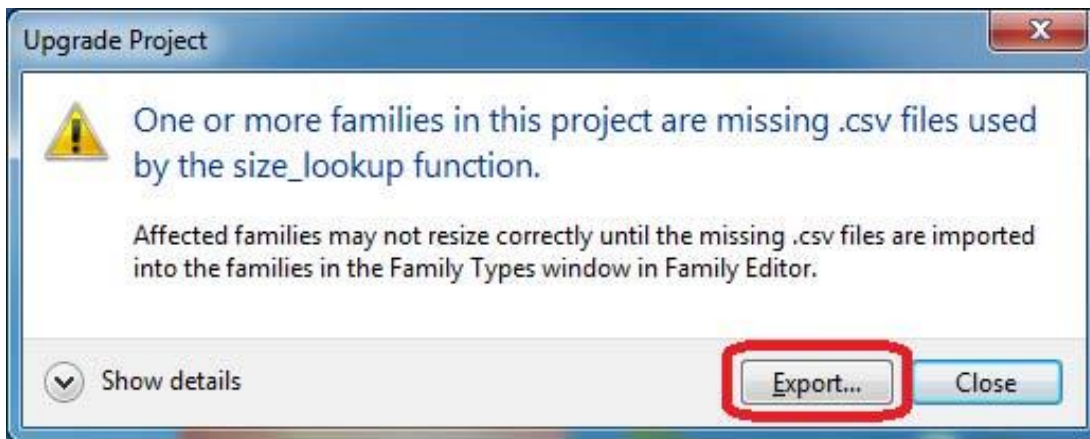
Revit 2013-2014 Upgrade

Verify and copy all your lookup tables used in Revit 2013 to the correct 2014 lookup table folder.

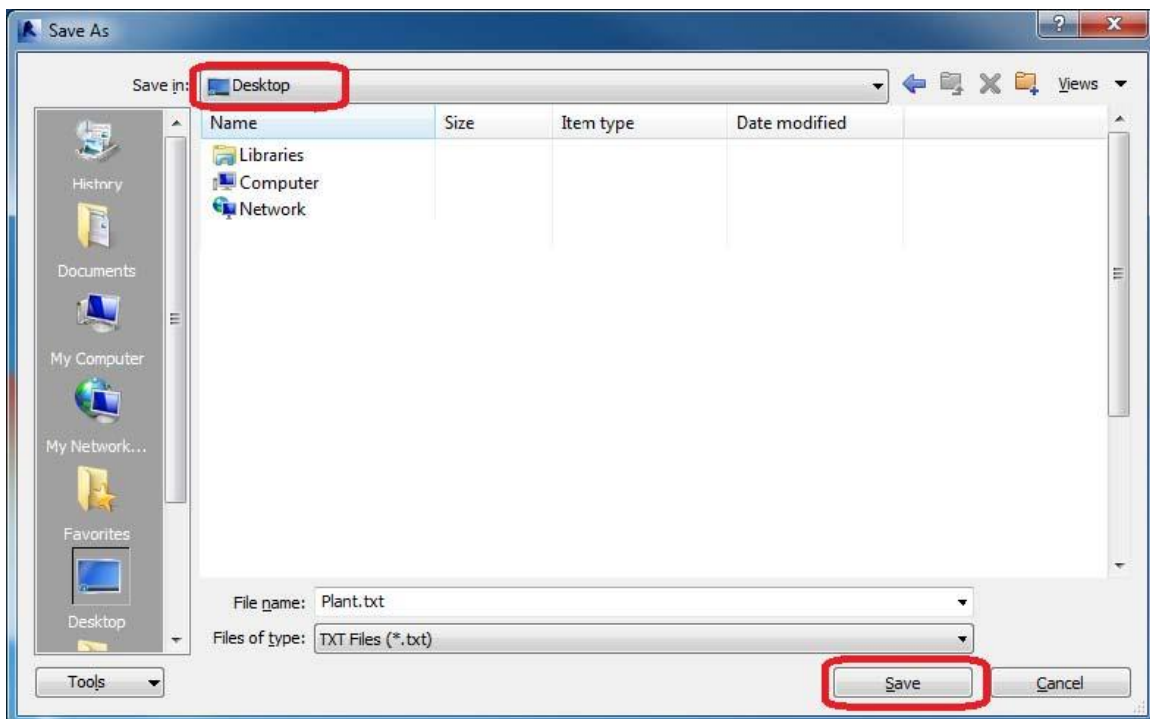
Open your 2013 and 2014 Revit.ini files and locate your working lookup table folder. This could be located on your PC or the Network.



Export and save the txt file



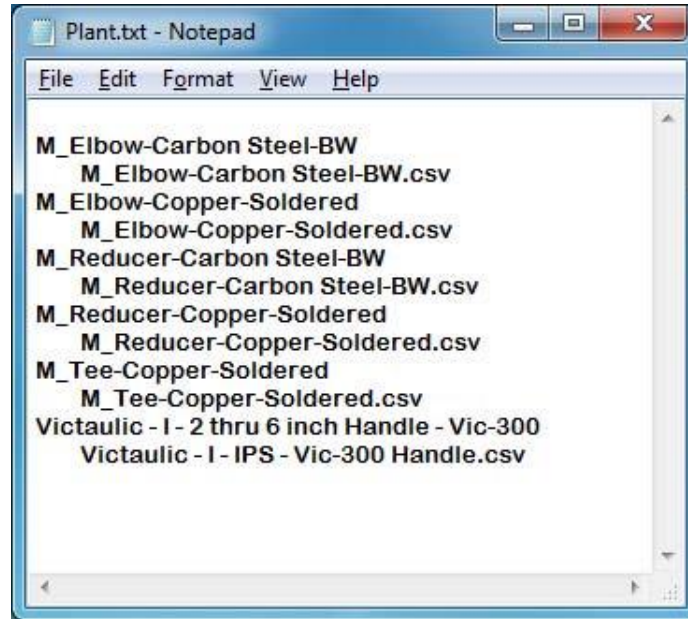
Opening the txt file you can see the missing lookup tables.

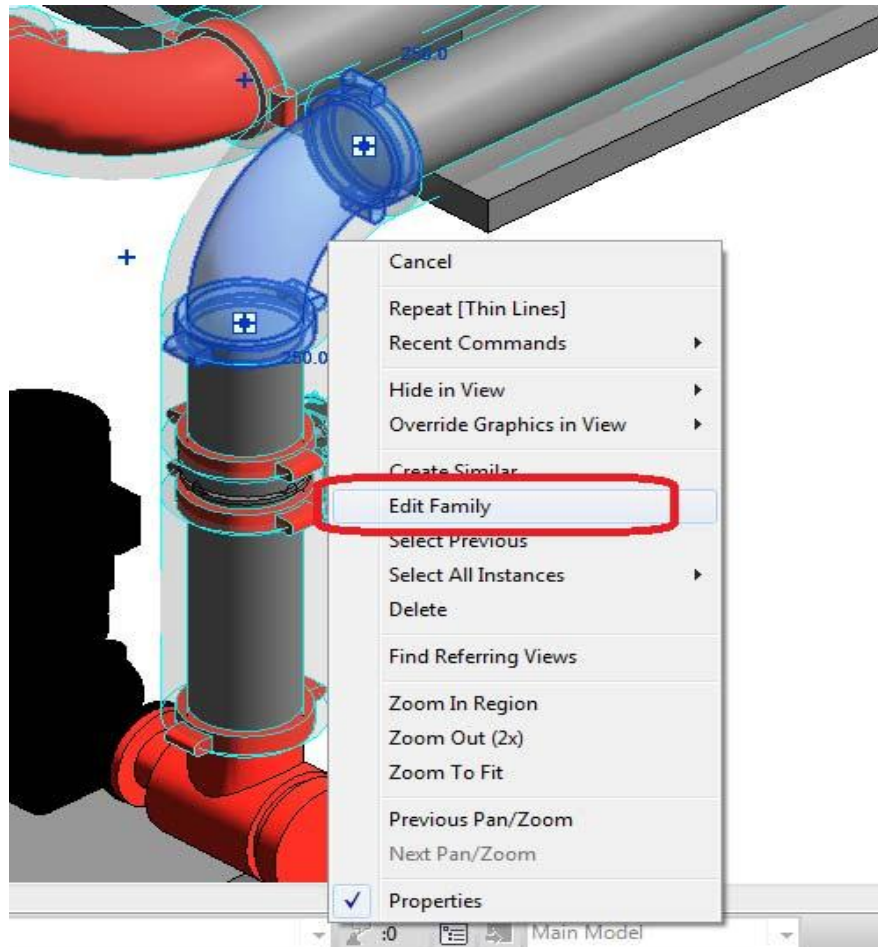


You will need to locate these lookup tables and put them in your lookup table Pipe folder for 2014.

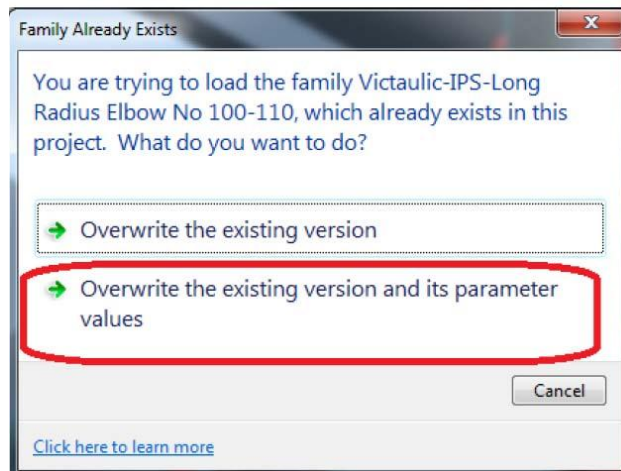
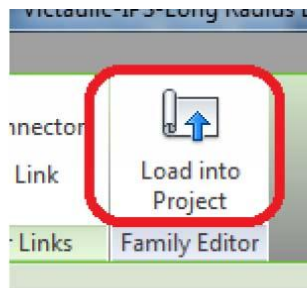
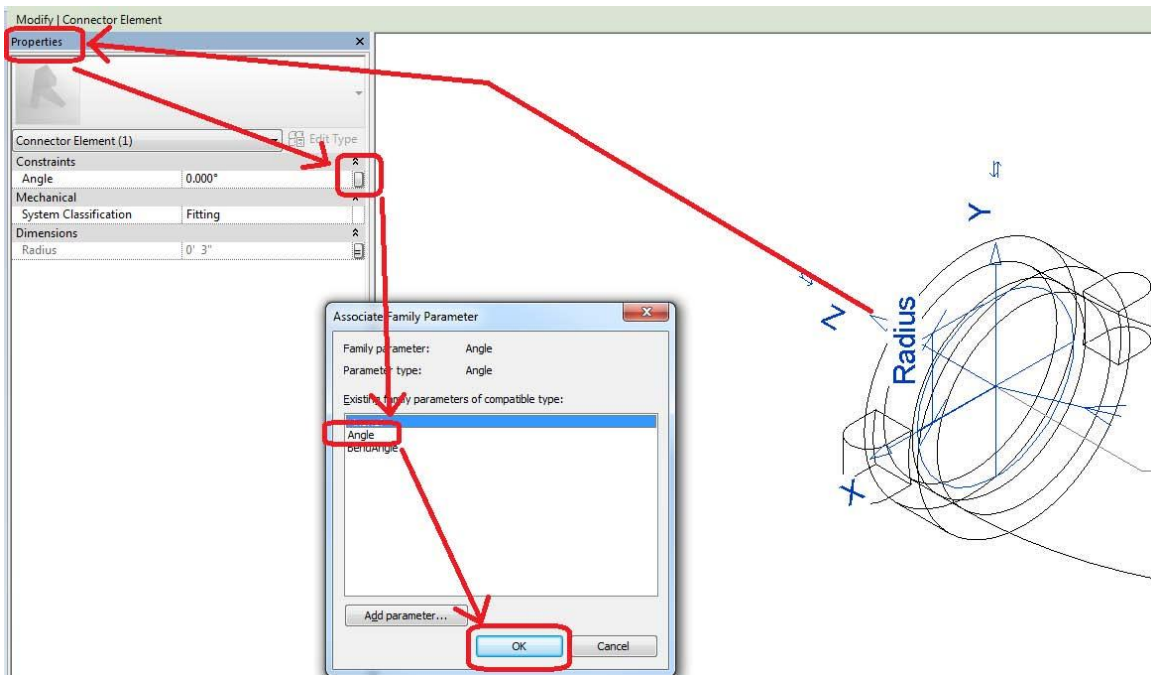
You will then need to repeat the conversion with all the required lookup tables.
